Also, I understand the reason that we are closing Moe's is because of the past rent, utilities, and no upkeep of Moe's. That's the reason and I think that should have been addressed with the employees.

Mayor Babb advised this was a recommendation from staff as well. I just came on board as a mayor three weeks ago, so I'm not totally familiar with all the past history. I do agree with this employee, we want jobs and that's our main goal. Our goal is never to put a business out of business, but the Commission must run as a business and treat him with the same fairness as we treat any other business. It breaks my heart to see any business go out of business because it's on our watch. It's not something we take lightly. I think at the last Commission meeting we voted unanimously to proceed with this action that is taken tonight.

Commissioner Walker replied I have a concern with the water on the floor of the restaurant went I came in there and customers were in there. It was almost like the swimming pool was inside the building. I'm concerned that someone's going to have an accident and the City will be held liable. Even though Moe should have insurance, it still will be a liability for the City. I think it would be best for us to have the building fixed before it is operating again.

Mayor Babb announced the employer is supposed to notify the employee of the situation with the restaurant.

Mr. Moe replied this is the first time I found out why I'm being evicted. I received nothing from the City, I just heard it through the grapevine that I'm being voted to be evicted. I just want to set the record straight, I am not in arrears on rent. That can be verified. The utilities, I was blindsided. We paid it last week and I have a cancelled check. For the record, this the first time I'm told why I'm being evicted. I got no notification, no phone calls, and no letters. What was I going to tell them? I was handed the restaurant three months in arrears, so don't evict me on something I didn't do. I'm sorry to the staff that they have to hear it like that.

Report of the Mayor:

Mayor Babb announced a Town Hall Meeting in Clewiston in reference to the water discharge from Lake Okeechobee. We have a lot at stake, it's our livelihood at stake. So, if you have the opportunity to come out to that meeting to find out what's going on and see how you can play a role or part in supporting the economy here in the South. The meeting location is at 370 Holiday Isle Drive in Clewiston, it's at New Harvest Church at 6:00P.M.. At our last Commission Meeting, I mentioned my desire to reinstate our Youth Council to give the young people the opportunity to give their input. I realized we had an ordinance that recognizes a Youth Council, so I'm going to ask staff to look into that.

Report of the City Manager:

Mr. Williamson announced I would like to introduce our Administrative Assistant, her name is Ashley Davis. Ms. Davis started working with the City of Pahokee Monday and she comes to us with experience in commerce, retail, and customer service. We are very pleased to have her in the City of Pahokee. The Back to School Bash we have been planning very diligently. The Back to School Bash will be held August 6th at the Pahokee High School. We try to improve every year on this event and we are excited about this year event. Just a recap, we have entered into a contract for the repairs at the Marina. Mayor Babb announced we will keep Lt. Piccolo in our prayers.

Commissioner Walker inquired can we get an update on the finance director position.

Mr. Williamson replied we are still collecting resumes and setting interviews.

Commissioner Walker inquired when you anticipate a finance director being hired or a time-frame.

Mr. Williamson responded I think it's safe to say in another two weeks or so.

Commissioner Walker announced we had to events in the community this past weekend. One with YMUnite (Young Mother's Unite), I'm encourage our young people to get involved. Also, we had a guest speaker for an elderly lecture and it rained our elderly in. Just wanted to let you know there are things that are going on in our community that's positive.

Vice Mayor Hill advised we really need to make sure that we read this gymnasium contract because it sounds like we are probably going to be losing out on the gym. I don't have anything against someone coming in trying to do what they're supposed to do for our City, but I have issues with language on the agreement. I think we can do just as much as this foundation could do. I think these are the type of things that get us in situations five years from now.
