Motion by Commissioner Biggs. Second by Vice Mayor Walker.

Motion carried unanimously.

Reverend Margaret Smart stated the water pressure is terrible in the Juniper, Kismet, and Garden Place area. She advised surveys have been completed, regarding the matter, letters have been mailed, and calls have been made to the Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department (PBCWUD).

Mayor Walkes advised the City of Pahokee will follow up on the matter.

Pastor James White, of the United Missionary Baptist Church, advised he would like to follow up on the Building Permit Waiver.

City Attorney Brandenburg stated he has the agreement, which advises the following: in return for the Building Waiver Permit, the United Missionary Baptist Church will have to pull a Building Permit within the next year, and by doing so, their facility will be made available for City Meeting needs, for five (5) years upon reasonable notice and in the event of an emergency situation, their facility will be made available upon shorter notice, which will constitute benefit to the City for the waiver of the fees.

Pastor White agreed to the terms that were stated by City Attorney Brandenburg.

Ashley Wilson, sophomore at Pahokee High School, advised approximately six to twelve of Pahokee High School's sophomores are planning to embark on a trip to Spain, in June 2015, for two weeks. The estimated cost of the trip is approximately \$3,000.00 to \$5,000.00 per student. Ashley Wilson requested donations, fundraising ideas, and/or aid in acquiring sponsors and she presented an overview of the trip to Spain.

Commissioner Biggs suggested that the City of Pahokee initiate a citywide fundraiser for the trip.

Mayor Walkes commended the Pahokee High School sophomores for presenting their trip before the Commission and requested that the community aid in assisting with the trip as well.

Presentations:

Strong Hearts for Children – Nina Wills, Bridges of Pahokee Outreach Coordinator, presented *Healthy Hearts for Children*. (See attached)

Mayor Walkes inquired if Bridges of Pahokee has presented Strong Hearts for Children to various church groups.

Nina Wills replied Bridges of Pahokee developed a forum and they have several ideas as to how they would get the word out. Bridges of Pahokee plans to present at Pahokee High School, in one of the classes, and initiate a Community Barbecue, as a means of spreading the awareness.

Ivory Paschal presented Certificates of Appreciation to 10 students that participated in the Youth Summit.

City Manager Moore announced the City of Pahokee is raising funds to send some of the students to a conference called *Preventing Crime in the Black Community*, at the end of the month. Contributions are welcomed.

Mrs. Paschal advised the cost of the conference is \$350.00 per student; thus far, eight students will attend the conference.

Rashonda Warren, Protective Inspection Supervisor, and Erica Washington, presented the Code Enforcement Report. (See attached)

Commissioner Babb recommended that the "No Dumping" signs be enlarged.

City Manager Moore asked City Attorney Brandenburg to give an update on the Old Hospital.

City Attorney Brandenburg advised there is a specific provision regarding nuisance abatement in the Ordinance and the City of Pahokee is requesting that the Owners of the Old Hospital property be brought before the Special Magistrate. The Special Magistrate will make a determination if the property is a nuisance, based on the facts that are presented, and authorize City Attorney Brandenburg to file a lawsuit in the County Court, to require the Owners of the Old Hospital Property to abate the nuisance, which may possibly require demolition of the edifice.

Commissioner Hill suggested that the Citizens be informed about the proper permitting procedures, prior to purchasing properties.

Commissioner Biggs inquired as to how the City of Pahokee can ensure that Home Owners are following the State Laws, as well as the City of Pahokee's procedures.

City Attorney Brandenburg advised once the affidavit is signed, the City of Pahokee is no longer responsible for following up with the Property Owners.

City Manager Moore stated the Building Official oversees the entire process and inspects the work that is to be done.

Employee of the Quarter was presented to Sedric Clervan, Program Coordinator.

Director of the Quarter was presented to Ebony Bruton, Director of Finance.

Report of the Mayor:

Mayor Walkes advised he was approached by a representative of the Republic of Suriname, in regards to the creation of a partnership called *Sister Cities*. He requested that the Commission support the venture and advised that the City of Pahokee has a Letter of Interest, which expresses what the City of Pahokee desires, as it relates to the Sister City relationship. Mayor Walkes read the letter as follows:

Dear President Desiré Delano Bouterse,

Recently Mr. Richenel Claudio Kerindongo spoke with the City of Pahokee's Mayor, Colin Walkes. They discussed the possibility of the Republic of Suriname and the City of Pahokee becoming Sister City partners. This letter is written to confirm our interest and commitment to such a partnership. City officials are very much aware that this partnership has the potential to carry out the widest possible diversity of activities of any international program, including every type of municipal, business, professional, educational and cultural exchange or project. We also believe that Sister City programs are unique in that they inherently involve the three main sectors in a community: local government, businesses, and a wide variety of citizen volunteers (and civil society or non-profit organizations).

We look forward to exploring your offer of share your technology in agriculture, communication, import-export and taking advantage of our mutual love for sports.

The City of Pahokee extends interest with Republic of Suriname through economic growth, technology, agricultural, communication, import/export, and sports. We look forward to a long a prosperous partnership with your Republic.

New Business:

RESOLUTION 2014 – 11 – A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PAHOKEE AND THE SCHOOL BOARD OF PALM BEACH COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSE FOR TRANSPORTATION OF STUDENTS TO SUMMER CAMP PROGRAMS.

Michael Aronson, Principal of Pahokee Middle School, advised Pahokee Middle School have been granted the opportunity to host a Summer Camp for enrichment, tutoring, and recreation. The Division of Human Services is helping to fund the project. Mr. Aronson stated the Summer Camp is free, the hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the age ranges from 10 years old to 14 years old. The limit of the Summer Camp is 100 students and the application must be completed before it is submitted. Mr. Aronson stated they would like to partner with the City of Pahokee for transportation purposes.

Approval of Resolution 2014 - 11

Motion by Vice Mayor Walker. Second by Commissioner Biggs. Motion carried unanimously.

Report of the City Manager:

City Manager Moore introduced Jacquetta Hendrix, Kenyatta A'Giza, and Bocara Banks as the new employees from the Reconnect Program. He announced there will be another group of employees from the Reconnect Program, and they will be interning for five (5) weeks. City Manager Moore requested the Commission's approval and authorization to forward the Sister City Letter of Interest for the Republic of Suriname, to the appropriate representatives.

Approval of Letter of Interest Republic of Suriname

Motion by Commissioner Babb. Second by Vice Mayor Walker.

Motion carried unanimously.

City Manager Moore requested a letter of support of the funding for West Tech, which will go to the Governor.

Vice Mayor Walker advised the Glades Career Readiness Roundtable is requesting funding from the government, to help support the academy at West Tech.

Approval of Letter of Support to Government for West Tech Motion by Vice Mayor Walker. Second by Commissioner Hill. Motion carried unanimously.

City Manager Moore advised an additional \$7,800.00 Tax Lien was assessed to the \$1,200.00 Tax Lien on the property next to Commissioner's Park. City Manager Moore stated the Commission approved for the City of Pahokee to pay the \$1,200.00 Tax Lien on the property and recommended that the additional balance be paid as well. He advised the property will be utilized for the extension of Commissioner's Park.

Commissioner Babb inquired about the additional cost associated with property and asked if the City of Pahokee has requested for Palm Beach County to waive the liens on the property.

City Attorney Brandenburg replied the City of Pahokee would have to pay the taxes that were previously accrued on the property, before the purchase of the property. Palm Beach County cannot waive the Tax Liens on the property.

Vice Mayor Walker inquired about the cost associated with renovating the tennis court, at Commissioner's Park.

City Manager Moore replied the cost will be approximately \$160,000.00.

Approval to pay delinquent Tax Lien on PCN 48-37-42-18-18-000-0522 Motion by Vice Mayor Walker. Second by Commissioner Babb. Motion carried unanimously.

City Manager Moore stated the Staff has begun to work on the Budget for next year and he provided a Budget Timeline. He announced that Senator Latvala committed to visiting the City of Pahokee, during the Palm Beach County Day event, and he will be present on Saturday, May 17th, 2014 at 11:00 a.m. Senator Latvala would like to discuss some of the results of their efforts during Palm Beach County Day and the current Legislative session.

Vice Mayor Walker inquired about Brandon Carson appearing before the Commission, and asked if City Manager Moore followed up with the Site Collectors that visited the City of Pahokee.

City Manager Moore replied he will reach out to Mr. Carson and request for him to appear before the Commission. He advised he has communicated with some of the Site Collectors, but the letter has not been sent.

Vice Mayor Walker inquired about the letter that was to be sent to Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), pertaining to the road on the Herbert Hoover Dike at Pahokee Campground and Marina.

City Manager Moore replied he did not send the letter because FDOT stated they would not be able utilize funds for the road, during the meeting with Congressman Alcee Hastings.

City Manager Moore and Mayor Walkes will establish a date for the State of the City Address.

Report of the City Attorney:

City Attorney Brandenburg stated the Charter Review Board had a meeting at 5:30 p.m. today and requested for him to draft up language for the Charter Review Committee for the Commission's consideration.

Old Business:

Lutheran Services Agreement – The Commission approved for City Manager Moore to finalize the negotiations with Lutheran Services'.

Marina Agreement – The Marina Agreement will be presented at the upcoming Commission Meeting.

City Hall Referendum – City Manager Moore will follow up on the Commission's request for additional information, for the City Hall Referendum.

Gymnasium Renovation Project – City Manager Moore advised the permit is being processed and it should be ready by the end of the week.

Economic Development Initiative – City Manager Moore stated the items are inclusive in the Report of the City Manager.

George Boyer Enterprise Landscape Contract — City Manager Moore advised George Boyer Enterprise will maintain the trees for three (3) months; thereafter, the City will resume responsibility for the maintenance of trees. The City of Pahokee will utilize the water truck, provided via Palm Beach County, for the watering of the trees. City Manager Moore recommended that the City of Pahokee accepts the contract with Boyer Enterprise,

Approval of George Boyer Enterprise

RESOLUTION 2014 – 13_A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF PAHOKEE AND GEORGE BOYER ENTERPRISE FOR STATE ROAD 715 AND STATE ROAD 15 LANDSCAPE PROJECT.

Motion by Vice Mayor Walker. Second by Commissioner Babb. Motion carried unanimously.

Thalle Construction – City Manager Moore discussed the proposed payment schedule for one of the City of Pahokee's properties on State Road (SR) 715, which will be leased. He advised his recommendation would be to initially collect the \$7,200.00 at the beginning of the year of purchase. The lease on the property will be valid for 24 months, with the option of extending the lease for an additional six (6) months.

Approval of Thalle Construction Agreement

Motion by Commissioner Biggs. Second by Vice Mayor Walker. Motion carried unanimously.

Employee Survey – City Manager Moore stated the Employee Surveys are anticipated being submitted by June 3rd, 2014 and will be available by the June 10th, 2014 Commission Meeting.

Commissioner Babb suggested that the Human Resources Department copy and distribute all of the Employee Surveys to the Commission. He stated he will summarize what the findings indicate.

City Manager's Performance Plan/Evaluation – Commissioner Babb recommended that the lead-person presents information as a guide, to determine if the City Manager has met the requirements and also to prevent the City Manager from receiving unfair accountability.

New Business:

Commissioner's Park Improvement Project – City Manager Moore stated two bids have been received for the Commissioner's Park Improvement Project. One of the bids were \$95, 771.00 and the other bid was \$97, 761.00. The Committee reviewed the items closely and the difference found in the bids were \$1,990.00, the quality of the game tables, and the vision for Commissioner's Park; therefore, REP Services Inc. was selected. City Manager Moore recommended that the City of Pahokee selects REP Services Inc.

Approval to select REP Service for the Commissioner's Park Improvement Project Motion by Vice Mayor Walker. Second by Commissioner Biggs. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioners Comments:

Commissioner Biggs advised she is the Chairperson for Democratic Club of the Glades and she knows several candidates that are interested in having Meet and Greets, at the Pahokee Campground and Marina. She inquired about the legalities of the candidates having the Meet and Greets at the Pahokee Campground and Marina.

City Attorney Brandenburg replied the Meet and Greets are legal at the Pahokee Campground and Marina, but the Candidates are subject to, and will have to pay, the normal rates associated with renting the facility at the Pahokee Campground and Marina.

City Manager Moore advised rates have not been established for the facility at the Marina, but previous Organization that have utilized the facility have been asked to make contributions or donations to various events and activities that the City of Pahokee has each year..

Commissioner Biggs announced that there will be a Meet and Greet for Marsha Andrews, at the Banyan Tree Restaurant in Belle Glade, on May 15th, 2014. Marsha Andrews will also be present at the Chamber Breakfast on tomorrow, May 14th, 2014. Commissioner Biggs announced that Senator Latvala stated one million dollars has already been approved by the Legislature, for the roads and streets in the Glades area. Also, one million dollars has been approved for the water and nine million dollars have been allocated for FDOT to work on roads and streets throughout the Glades area; however, the Governor's signature is pending for the approvals. Commissioner Biggs recognized Commissioner Borroughs and bid all good night.

Commissioner Babb proposed that the Commission considers having quarterly meetings at the Workshops to brainstorm and dialogue in regard to the best methods in moving the City of Pahokee forward. Commissioner Babb stated he has noticed that the City of Pahokee's meetings are not advertised in the Palm Beach Post and suggested that information be presented to the Palm Beach Post's staff, in a timely manner. Commissioner Babb inquired about the status of the Marquee Sign for the City Hall and asked if the City of Pahokee has requested any funds or grants for the public park at the Pahokee Campground and Marina.

City Manager Moore replied the Marquee Sign will be placed by the end of the week. He advised as of late, the City of Pahokee has not applied for any grants and the Army Corp of Engineers has recently granted the City of Pahokee approval to submit applications for improvements at the Pahokee Campground and Marina.

Commissioner Hill bid all good night.

Vice Mayor Walker announced that a Ministerial Alliance of Pahokee was successfully organized. Reverend White is the Presidents, Bishop Holmes is the Vice President, and Pastor Pattie is the Secretary.

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Walkes adjourns the meeting at 9:19 p.m.

I understand that I may protect myself from potential financial risk by hiring a licensed contractor and having the permit flight in his or her rame instead of my own name, I also understand that a contractor is required by law to be licensed in Florida and to list his or her license numbers on permits or contracts.

 Owners violating the above shall be subject to a penalty under Florida Statue 455.228 and may be issued a citation and/or civil penalty.

- Florida Statue 489.103(7) requires all owners of property acting as their own contractor to complete the following disclosure statement. This is an affidavit for owner/builders applying for building permits under the owner/builder contractor
- I. I. UNDESTAND that state law requires construction to be done by a licensed contractor and have applied for an owner-builder permit under an exemption from the law. The exemption specifies that I, as the owner of the property listed, may act as my own contractor with certain restrictions even though I do not have a license.



Pulling an Owner/Builder Permit is Risky Business!



If you do not intend to do the work yourself and have been asked by someone without a contractor's license to pull the permit, you are at risk of financial harm.

Section 489.103 (7), Florida Statutes requires that when property owners act as their own contractor, they must supervise the work being performed. Any person working on your building who is not licensed must be employed by you, which means that you must deduct F.I.C.A. and withholding tax and provide workers' compensation for that employee.

Without workers' compensation insurance, you could be held liable for injuries incurred on your property. Typically, your homeowners' insurance policy will not honor your claim if the work being performed required a licensed contractor. You could end up responsible for thousands of dollars of medical bills.



Not only is it dangerous, but it's against the law.

Section 455.227(1)(j), Florida Statutes prohibits any person from aiding, assisting, procuring, employing or advising any unlicensed person or entity. Individuals who aid unlicensed persons may face fines of up to \$5,000.
