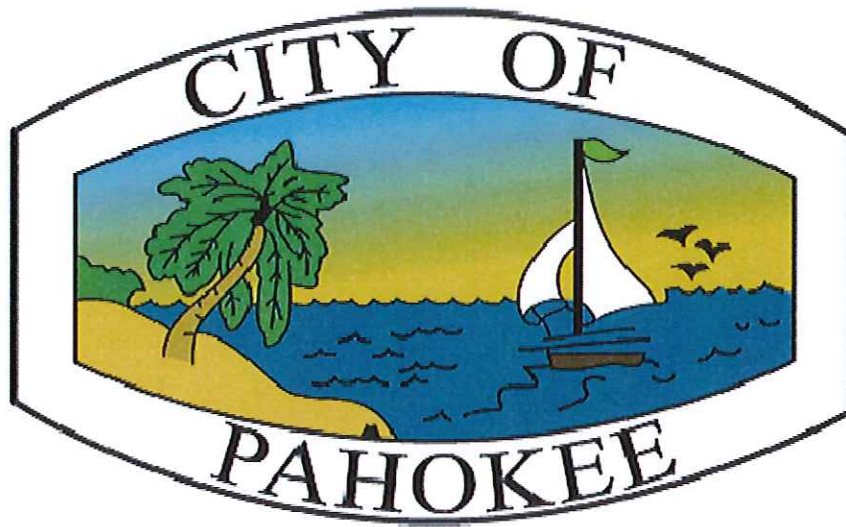

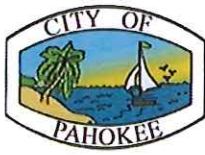

Commissioner Murvin concerned with the price PBSO is charging for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Parade and saying the citizens can't afford to pay the required amount. I don't want this annual parade to stop because it is a part of our history.

Lt. Picciolo advised this is the first time this concern has been brought to his attention.

Vice-Mayor Hill suggested working together and combining the parade with the Tri-Cities.

Lt. Picciolo advised they need more time to prepare for events.

Mayor Babb inquired if we can use two (2) officers instead of four (4) officers.

Lt. Picciolo replied they normally have four (4) work this event each year.

Commissioner Walker inquired when did the MLK Parade not become a City event. The City of Pahokee was a sponsor and the Ebony Elite Ladies co-sponsor. I will make a motion to have the MLK Parade become a City event, so it can be budget.

Commissioner Walker requested an amendment to the budget to accommodate the Ebony Elite Ladies Society with the cost of PBSO Officer patrolling this event.

Mr. Chandler Williamson replied the City will cover the \$700.00 for PBSO Officer to ensure the safety of the residents, but let's work together in the future.

Report of the Mayor:

Mayor Babb announced on Sunday, January 15, 2017 the Annual Mayors Parade will be hosted by Commissioner McKinlay at the South Florida Fair, I will be representing Pahokee in the parade. Also, thanks the Commission for approving the Alma Wallace Wright Proclamation (which is more like a sister that passed) and the City for all of their condolences/flowers. The Annual Harvey J. Pool Scholarship Banquet is scheduled for Saturday at 6:00pm, the keynote speaker for this event is Hall of Famer Nate Moore (*Miami Dolphins Wide-Receiver*). I currently have ten (10) tickets to sale for \$20.00. The next two (2) businesses for recognition will be from Commissioner Holmes for the Businesses of the Month.

Report of the City Manager:

Mr. Williamson thanks the Commission for supporting the City through 2016, we've had some success. Yet, there's more we need to accomplish in the City of Pahokee. We are working diligently on economic development and infrastructure in this year of 2017 (such as businesses and housing projects). Also, Commissioner Mckinlay will be hosting a community outreach event at Belle Glade Library on January 23, 2017 from 6:00pm until 7:30pm (discussion for financing for home improvement).

Report of the City Attorney:

Mr. Brandenburg informed the residents and board that the Commission can adopt a resolution suspending an elected official until they regain health to fully participate (*due to inquiries from members of the public and residents via phone*).

Commissioner Murvin announced concerns about Commissioner Walker and advised it's nothing personal. She feels there should be a motion to suspend Commissioner Walker until she's healthier.

Commissioner Holmes replied he hasn't heard that, all he's heard is compassion. She's trying to do her job and I think she's doing an adequate job. I think we are rushing to judgment with that.

Mayor Babb responded we need to have some time to digest what was said, but a decision need to be made at some point.

Commissioner Holmes advised if we would follow-up with her health, we would know that they've moved her to Glades Health Care Center (closer to home). We need to pray that God continue to bring her back to health. She's trying to do her job and wants to do her job.

Mayor Babb replied it's not a removal, it's a temporary suspension.

Vice-Mayor Hill responded I agree with Commissioner Murvin, she's needs to take care of her health.

Commissioner Walker replied if anybody was concerned about me, they should approach me. Nobody on the Commission, except Commissioner Holmes has come to visit me. I was elected by the people, not the Commission. I feel great, so don't rule me out like I am unable to make a decision.

Mr. Brandenburg advised if this is what you want to do, we have to motion to prepare a resolution for the next commission meeting.

Commissioner Murvin advised this is business, not personal. I think you need to take care of your health until you are able to return. I have nothing against Commissioner Walker.

Commissioner Holmes announced this is wrong.

Commissioner Walker wishes everyone a Happy New Year and pray we can come together for our City. Also, thank you for the MLK Celebration.

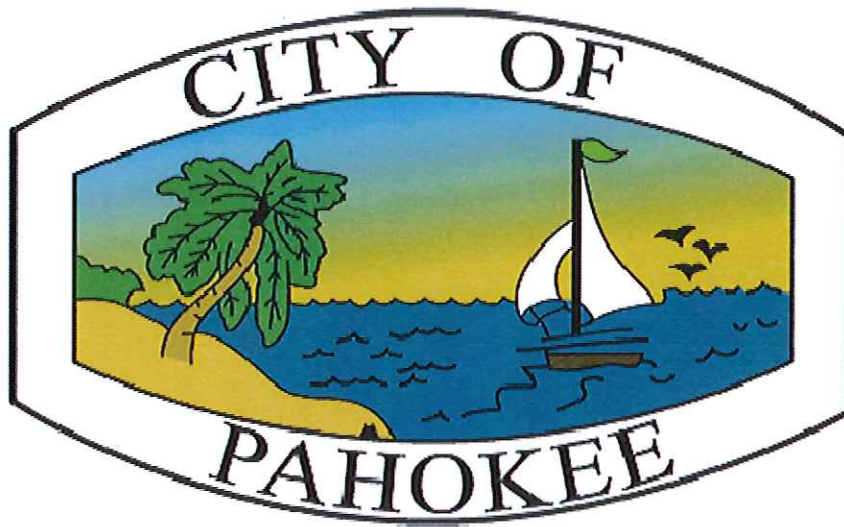

# RESOLUTIONS

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017 - 03**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE,  
FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING A DATE AND TIME  
FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE POSSIBLE  
TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF COMMISSIONER  
DIANE WALKER FROM THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE.**

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Walker was elected by the qualified vote of the City of Pahokee on March 15, 2016, during a regular scheduled City election for a period of three (3) years; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Walker has been unable to physically attend the City of Pahokee Commission meeting for nine (9) consecutive meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Charter § 2.07 provides that a Commissioner's absence that has been unexcused for four consecutive meetings shall require the removal of that Commissioner and an appointment of a replacement; and

**WHEREAS**, the initial two (2) meetings were excused by the Commission; the following seven (7) meetings were not excused; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2-30 of the Code of Ordinances provides for a Commissioner to participate by telephone in the rare occurrence of not being physically present during the meetings and Commissioner Walker has participated by telephone at almost all meetings; however, it does not allow continued participation by telephone for extended durations; and

**WHEREAS,** Florida Statutes Section 112.524 provides for the suspension of a Commission member if the Commission was created by a municipal charter and the member is unable to fulfill his or her duties of office.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE THAT:**

- Section 1.** Commissioner Walker is hereby commended for her honorable and distinguished services to the City of Pahokee.
- Section 2.** Commissioner Walker has made a considerable effort to participate by telephone during Commission meetings.
- Section 3.** The participation by telephone allowance was created for the occasional inability of a Commissioner to be physically present during a meeting; however, participation by telephone was not and is not a substitute for the attendance from the Commission meetings continuously, or for a prolonged period of time.
- Section 4.** The Commission hereby finds and determines that participation by telephone is awkward and inefficient and is not a substitute for physical presence on a continuing basis, makes it hard for the absent Commissioner to fully participate in the meetings, and deprives the residents of face-to-face interaction with the elected officials when it occurs continuously for a prolonged period of time.
- Section 5.** The Commissioners and residents are not aware of Commissioner Walker's confidential medical records and are only cognizant of Commissioner Walker's continuous absences from Workshops, Commission meetings, and other City functions.
- Section 6.** This Resolution will be considered on January 24, 2017, during the Regular City Commission agenda.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COMMISSION HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT:**

- Section 1.** Commissioner Walker has been absent for seven (7) Workshops and seven (7) Commission meetings that have not been excused by the Commission.

- Section 2.** Attempts at participation by telephone have been difficult, are inefficient, and deprive the residents of face-to-face interaction on important City business, and as a result, Commissioner Walker has not been able to fully attend to and fulfill her responsibilities as a City Commissioner.
- Section 3.** The City Commission, under the provisions of Home Rule in the Florida Constitution, Chapter 112 and Chapter 166, Florida Statutes and the City Charter hereby suspend Commissioner Walker from her duties as City Commissioner until such time as she can attend the Commission meetings personally and fulfill the responsibilities of the office of City Commissioner.
- Section 4.** The remaining City Commissioners shall promptly appoint a resident of the City of Pahokee who is qualified under the Pahokee Charter to hold the office of City Commissioner for a temporary period. The temporary period shall begin immediately, and end when Commissioner Walker is able to attend Workshop and Commission meetings in person, and fulfill all responsibilities of a City Commissioner.

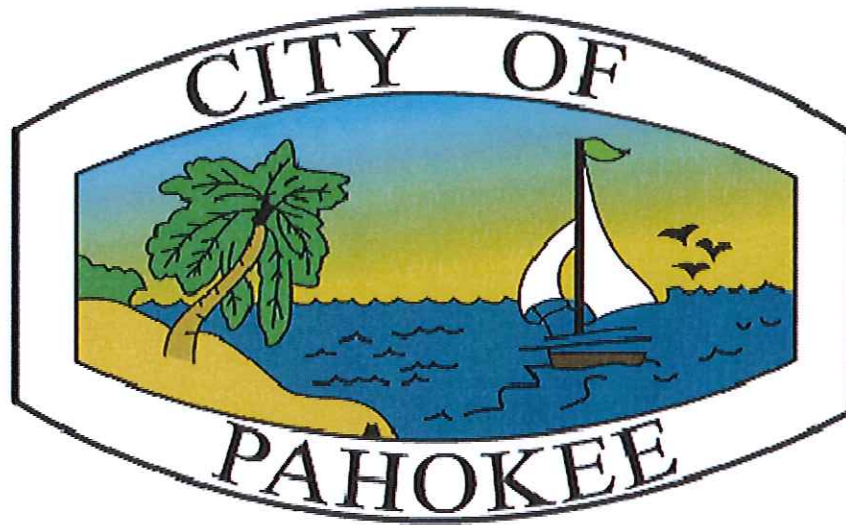

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY BUILDING MORATORIUM ON MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES / MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTERS AS FURTHER DEFINED HEREIN FOR A PERIOD OF SIX (6) MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF ADOPTION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR GEOGRAPHIC AREA COVERED; PROVIDING FOR THE DURATION OF MORATORIUM; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE, A GENERAL REPEALER CLAUSE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Pahokee, Florida, provides municipal services to its citizens, including regulation and licensing of businesses and issuance of permits; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida is considering legalizing the dispensing of marijuana, and adopting rules and regulations pertaining thereto; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens and general public to regulate the location of marijuana dispensaries / medical marijuana treatment centers in the event the State of Florida legalizes said dispensaries, whether for medical or recreational use; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has the responsibility and authority to determine what uses are best suited to particular zoning categories as well as land use categories with the City; and

WHEREAS, the City needs a period of time to review and study the impacts of marijuana dispensaries / medical marijuana treatment centers to the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS, the zoning ordinance is adopted pursuant to the City's Home Rule Powers as set forth in Florida Statutes Chapter 166; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is enacted in compliance with Florida Statutes Section 166.0413(c).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PAHOKEE, FLORIDA:

**SECTION 1. TEMPORARY BUILDING MORATORIUM UPON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES / MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTERS.** All activities relating to the acceptance, review and action upon permit applications for marijuana dispensaries / medical marijuana treatment centers are temporarily suspended in order for the City of Pahokee, through its officials and

staff, to have adequate time and opportunity to review and to determine the adequacy of application criteria, standards and other approval processes related to the issuance of said permits within the City of Pahokee. Based upon the foregoing, there is hereby imposed a temporary moratorium on the review and action upon permit applications for marijuana dispensaries / medical marijuana treatment centers. During the time the temporary moratorium is in effect, the City will accept no applications for permits for the operation of marijuana dispensaries / medical marijuana treatment centers.

**SECTION 2. MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES / MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTERS.** Marijuana Dispensaries / Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers shall mean a location or place permitted to sell legal marijuana / cannabis and / or a place where legal marijuana / cannabis is used in the management and care of a patient or the combating of disease or disorder.

**SECTION 3. GEOGRAPHIC AREA COVERED.** A temporary moratorium established in this ordinance shall be effective in the corporate and municipal boundaries of the City of Pahokee.

**SECTION 4. DURATION OF MORATORIUM / EXTENSION.**

(a) The temporary moratorium set forth in this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the effective date of this ordinance and shall terminate six (6) months after the said effective date. The City will accept no applications which are subject to the moratorium until the moratorium has expired.

(b) The City Commission may extend the temporary moratorium established in this ordinance by enactment of an ordinance one (1) time for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days upon a finding by the City Commission set forth in the ordinance that the problems giving rise to the need for a temporary moratorium established herein continue to exist.

**SECTION 5. PENALTIES.** Any individual, entity, or agent, who shall violate any provision of this ordinance or who fails to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be fined in an amount not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or be imprisoned for a period of time not to exceed sixty (60) days.

**SECTION 6.** That should any section or provision of this ordinance or any portion thereof, any paragraph, sentence, or word be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder hereof as a whole or part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.

**SECTION 7.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith be, and the same are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 8.** That this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage on second and final reading.
